Denver Chapter Scholarship

The Mile High Chapter announced last night that it had selected the first recipient of its Dave Sanders Memorial Information Technology Scholarship. That scholarship winner is Jeff Hulse, a graduating senior at Columbine High School. Mr Hulse has been admitted to Red Rocks Community College.

Dave Sanders was the teacher who died at Columbine High School on April 20, 1999. Mr Sanders at the time ran the CHS Computer Lab. The Mile High Chapter of AITP established this scholarship in his memory. It is open to any graduating senior at Columbine who intends to pursue a 2 or 4 year degree in any technology field. Mr. Hulse intends to seek a 4 year CIS degree, most likely completing his degree program at Metro State College in Denver.

The Sanders fund is also used to provide advanced training for Columbine High School faculty and staff. While no funds have been expended at this time for that purpose, Infotec was approached by Mile High AITP and agreed to offer MCSE certification training to one CHS staff member. This training was taken and completed by Rich Long, the current head of the CHS computer lab.

The fund is administered by AITP's Foundation for Information Technology Education. All donations to the fund are tax deductible.

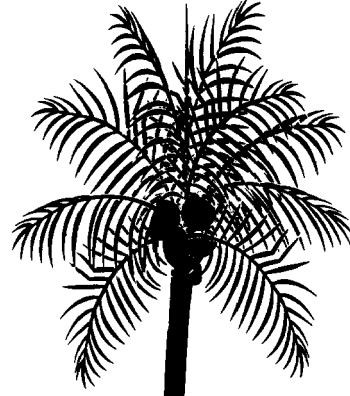
