On Tuesday, October 12, Oahu experienced a new peak demand for electricity, 1327 megawatts, the fourth time in two months a record was broken. The next day, HECO had to ask customers to conserve to avoid island-wide blackouts or rolling brownouts. The immediate cause was extremely hot weather, abetted by a growing use of air conditioning across the island. In the background is a booming economy -- construction, tourism, military all up.

Demand for electricity on this island is clearly accelerating rapidly. At the same time, the generating capacity is static, in fact no new generation has been added since 1992 and most units on Oahu are 30 to 50 years old. Aging units need more frequent and often longer maintenance, both planned and unplanned.

In addition, as an island, Oahu is entirely dependent on its own resources. Power can not be imported even from the Neighbor Islands. What happens when rising demand meets static and aging supply? How will Oahu deal with this electric power crunch? This has to be of concern to anyone in the technology business, or who just uses technology in business of daily life. High tech applications, of course, need not just electricity, but high quality reliable electricity. What is Hawaii's Energy Future? It is certainly too important to be left just to the utility company. HECO's presentation discusses these questions and more, followed by a free-ranging question and answer session.
